Kansas City 2017, A Gathering of the Bands Dear Nobles, Best Wishes

from my family to yours for a wonderful

2017. Let us collectively look to what is good in all of us, and extend that goodness outward to build a better world throughout next year.

As I sit down to write this column it is -13 F outside with a wind chill of -30 F. In other words it is mind numbingly cold. Thoughts of our upcoming activities ahead bring me to a much warmer state of mind however. As you may be aware foremost in the ASOB calendar this year is a departure from Oriental Band Competitions associated with the annual Imperial activities.

We made this change to make the annual ASOB Competitions more accessible to all our bands. Accessibility to our annual gig has been hampered over the years by a number of factors, chief among them being the following 2 challenges. 1. Changing geographic locations of the Imperial Sessions made it prohibitive for most bands to travel to the events due to the long distance and the associated air travel involved. 2. Right or wrong, over the years the ASOB band competitions become known as an event reserved for elite

and large size bands only. For this the Association takes full accountability for this untruth. We have done a poor job in the past communicating the openness to all bands and fun aspect of this annual event. Most saw little additional value in participating in the annual event.

Dealing with challenge #1 by choosing a more accessible location.

The current team of nobles managing the association on our behalf is passionate about bringing to you an annual event so you can enjoy and most important of all, is geographically more accessible. We had long sessions of head scratching, some navel gazing, but mostly used a business planning approach to come up with what we think is a good plan to move forward with.

Kansas City was chosen for geographic location within the Continental United States. A demographic study showed us that for most of our bands, Kansas City can be reached within a couple of days drive. SO it is road trip time everyone. Pack up the bus, pack up the van, and get on your favorite wheels because we are all gathering in Kansas City. Not ideal to those of us in the upper reaches of the North East or Northwest, but we love living where we are and used to this travel challenge.

Timing the Jamboree in early spring gives you an opportunity to tune up for the upcoming parade and regional competition season. In other words, a good opportunity to tune up before the busy season.

A Value Proposition to deal with Challenge #2

1. Build on your musical talents for free. The first annual Kansas City gathering of the bands takes on an educational aspect as well as Jamboree format. The foremost music virtuosos in the Oriental Band world will be available to offer workshops in further developing your skills in whether you are a horn player or a percussion virtuoso. You have new members in your band with no musical experience?

Don't quite know how to bring them up to speed? Bring them to Kansas City. You are a music director looking for some insights or lessons learned from other directors? Come to Kansas City and participate in the OB Directors open forum. Helping you build on your musical virtuosity helps you increase the value you bring to your Temple and our Philanthropy.

2. A Music Jamboree open to all skill levels and band size. The only qualification required to participate in the Kansas City Jamboree is a desire to perform. Size does not matter (you heard this one before I am sure). Seriously a few years ago a lone noble showed up at our Minneapolis event and declared he was a band of one and wished to compete. He regaled us with his horn and won our hearts with his positive approach, his ambition as well as his skill.

With the jamboree format, we are asking you to join us no matter your perceived skill level. Come ready to entertain us and have a lot of fun. We will have all the performance categories covered so that you can go back to your temple with appropriate recognition.

All Oriental Bandsmen are frustrated comedians

Most important of all, let us not forget one of the most important outcomes when we get together; and that is that we have mega fun together. At some level I think that we are all frustrated comedian wanna-be's. Kneeled over knee slapping laughter is a common occurrence in our social gatherings.

In closing, I look forward to seeing you in Kansas City as we join the hundreds who will be arriving. Come prepared to have a knee slapping, moon hollering, and eye tearing good old time together.



The Unit is looking forward to the Mid-Winter meeting, which will be


held in March on the beautiful River Walk in San Antonio. Stay tuned for more information on this great event.





MINUTES OF MID-WINTER MEETING

Old Fort Worth Historical Area, Fort Worth, TX, October 22, 2016

The 2016-2017 Association of Shrine Oriental Bands International, Mid-Winter Meeting was held in conjunction with the Executive Committee Strategic Meeting.

The A.S.O.B. Mid-Winter Meeting was opened by President Tom Crow on October 22, 2016 at 9:00 AM with welcoming remarks for all in attendance, the Pledge to the Flag by 3rd VP Darren DeHass, P.P.; prayer by 2nd VP Harry Pressman

A.S.O.B. Officers, and Past Presidents in attendance were: Tom Crow, Chris Tsaros, Harry Pressman, Darren DeHass, Don Moores, Ralph Jubb, Michael Hartup, Joe Brewton, David McCarthy and Jeff Moores.

The Officers in turn reviewed any previously unprinted activities after the last publication of the Na Khabar.

Secretary/Treasurer Don Moores – Further discussion was held regarding the operation of the Association as a business tabled from the last Mid-Winter Meeting. The By-Laws call for a Band that has not paid the current year's dues by the time of the annual meeting to be suspended. Discussion followed to determine the method of reinstatement. It was discussed to delay the re-application to the Association for reinstatement along with the payment of dues for the year the band was suspended and the current year's dues. This will be done for the Dues Year 2017.

In addition, the Secretary/Treasurer will send a second notice card to member bands which had not paid their current year's dues in the April time frame. Also, advertisers in the Na Khabar would also be sent an invoice for their ads.

The Secretary reported on the Financial status of the Association. The dues forms were given to the officers for distribution during their travels. The balances in the three Accounts are:

The cost of printing the one issue of the Na Khabar was discussed; the costs for the January 2016 issue were:

The January 2017 issue of the Na Khabar should run a similar cost, not significantly different. Discussion was held regarding going to 100% electronic issues because of the cost of the printing and mailing services. The Layout costs continue for the electronic issues because of the formatting, etc, is required for the electronic issues. It was decided that we would continue for January 2017 to print and distribute the Na Khabar and discuss this further at the next annual meeting.

Discussion of the Bandsman of the Year was discussed and it was noted that only one bandsman was nominated for the 2015-2016 year. It was recommended the members attending this Mid-Winter Meeting see if we can get some additional competition from the Associations for the next Bandsman of the Year.

Tom Crow summarized the Kansas City Jamboree schedule and procedures. The hotel is under contract and the Na Khabar has the registration and hotel information printed in the latest issue. The number of bands competing at Imperial has been steadily dropping since 2007 and the issue was to have a Jamboree at a more central part of the country. Another advantage of our Jamboree is all of the bands could stay together in one hotel and have the camaraderie of being together. Ladies of Ararat Shriners volunteered to handle decorations and hospitality. Ladies of Abdallah Shriners would like to have Draggin' Ladies degrees and maybe other subordinate degrees. Discussion was had about the Oriental Bands planning to come to Kansas City Jamboree. Plaques will be ordered by Harry Pressman and shipped to him in Houston because he will be driving. Kansas City will be stage competition only. The Annual Meeting will be called by the President to be held at the Jamboree, with the Election and Installation of Officers but, not taking in office until July after Imperial. In Daytona Beach there will be the Parade competition at the Main Imperial Parade and judging in the first couple or three blocks. No formal attire for the Awards Banquet or Installation. These plans for the first Jamboree is a trial to see if it is a feasible alternative to having all of our activities at Imperial. The Music Academy will hold the seminars during the Jamboree to see if we have better attendance at the seminars than in Tampa. A fraternal fundraiser for the Association of Shrine Oriental Bands International, in the form of a drawing and you must be present to win, will be held in Kansas City.

Mike Hartup, Chairman of Ladder of Smiles reported on the status of the Ladder of Smiles as of the end of September. This report only includes the months of July through September.

Tom Crow announced he had a letter granting the Association of Shrine Oriental Bands a date to present a wreath at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier in Arlington National Cemetery on June 19, 2017, at 1:15 PM. This is for the A.S.O.B., not Shriners International. Discussions were held about contact with Shriners International.

Roles of the Officers are designated in the Red Book as recently updated. Darren DeHass is going to investigate the use of an email blast system. The Secretary has a list of about 400 email addresses of members and officers. The 3rd VP is going to be provided with the Secretary's list of emails

and he is going to try to find a service that can provide the email blast at no or little cost.

Discussion was held regarding the transfer of material from Al Azhar consisting of instruments, horns, drums, etc. The cost of shipping this material to Abou Saad in Panama City, Panama is over \$2,300.00 and we had several donations making the total committed to this shipment \$1,800.00. Chris Tsaros stated enough money has been raised to make this happen.

Tom summarized the Officer Line vacancies on the A.S.O.B. Officer line. All of the officers should approach a number of potential candidates. We have no potential candidate for election this year.

The meeting was closed at 11:30 AM.

- Make sure the Bandsman of the Year is in every issue of the


Na Khabar. The Bandsman of the year guidelines show up in every issue.
